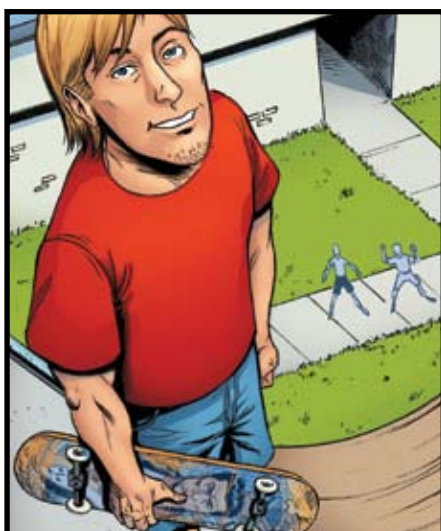

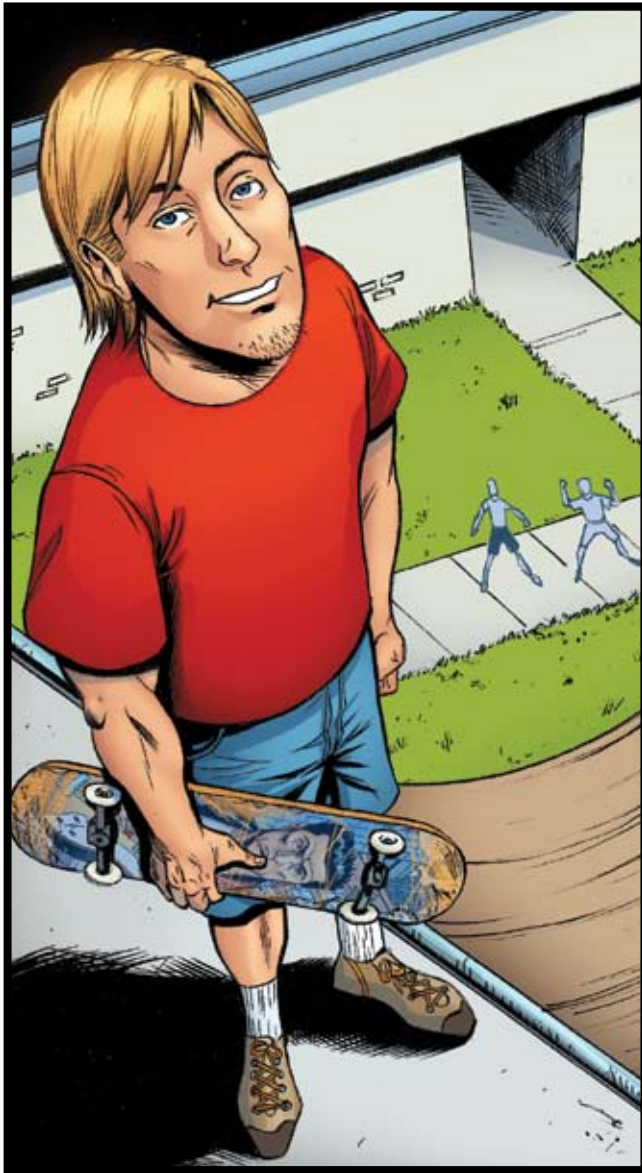

He was having a great time until he jumped a little short on the last shelf. He had to grab on with his fingertips. The shelf started swaying back and forth.

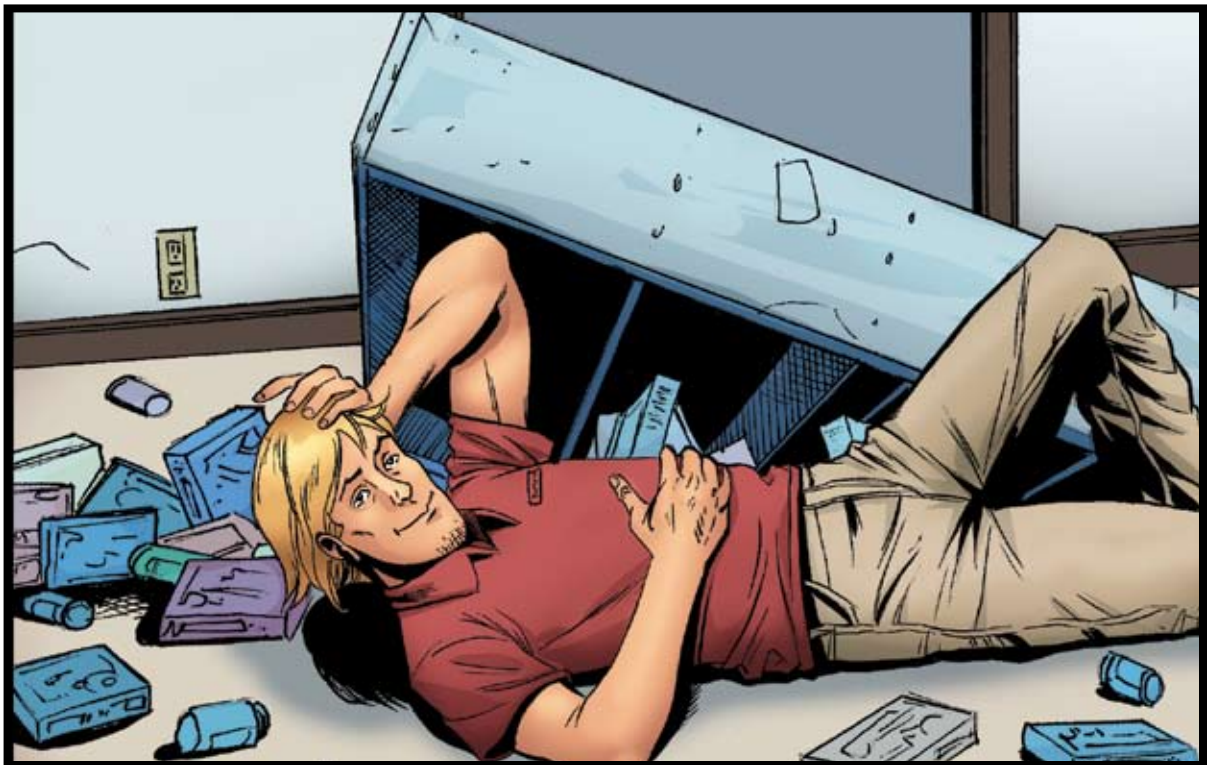
He yelled to all of the customers, "Run for your lives on Aisle 10!"
